# **OCDS** Committees

I have tried to emphasize the theme of **Carmelite communion** (communio, Latin; or koinonia, Greek). For me, **one expression of this communion is "committees"**. The definition of a committee is a group of people appointed for a certain task.

Looking at the **diversity of gifts** that Seculars in our Province have been entrusted, I desire to call forth the use of these gifts and put them **at the service of the wider Province**.

The intention of forming certain committees is <u>not</u> to create "executive boards". Rather, to form **groups of service**. Groups that I have in mind are in the area of social media, technology, finances (for example, gifted people who can advise on how to set up local groups with a bank account); Spanish language and other language groups; etc. The idea is that every local community should not have to reinvent the wheel and struggle alone. Rather, to have resources where local communities can reach out for support. For example, I do not have expertise in web design. But wouldn't it be great if we had a technology committee that I or anyone could reach out to? There are many other common needs.

This will take time and discernment. The idea at this moment is for us to think along these lines, acknowledge our gifts, and begin to put them at the service of the Secular Order in our Province. Stay tuned for more information.
