Andhra Pradesh's Carmelite mission

India, April 16, 2015 (Communicationes).- The Carmelites in the state of Andhra Pradesh have opted for entirely pastoral work. In these first years their focus has been to improve the living conditions of those around them. Later, and little by little, they will begin to introduce spirituality – more specifically, Teresian Carmelite spirituality.

The "Little Flower" school near Hyderabad aspires to have 18 classrooms. There are currently 15 equipped classrooms; the last three exist thanks to help from Friends of the Third World (Villarrobledo, Spain). The other three schoolrooms are expected to be ready by the end of 2015.

The Hyderabad mission, consisting of one parish, one near-parish, and a secondary station, serves 600 families.

In addition to the school, a church is being built in Hyderabad; the friar's chapel is being renovated; and an elevator is being planned – all this, without neglecting the pastoral care needed by the residents, a need which is growing.

May these lines encourage friends and benefactors to collaborate with the completion of these projects.
