Message From Fr. Donald Kinney, Provincial Delegate

Dear OCDS Brothers and Sisters,

Praised be Jesus Christ!

With our Holy Fr. Pope Benedict's resignation and the upcoming election of a new Pope, these are historic days for the Church and the world. St. Teresa of Jesus always emphasized the compelling need for us Carmelites to pray for the leaders of our Church. She even wrote that prayer for the leaders of the Church is help for the Lord himself (*Way of Perfection*, 1, 2). St. Thérèse, at the end of *Story of a Soul* (p. 253), lifts up this same ideal: "I want to be a daughter of the Church as our holy Mother St. Teresa was and to pray for the Holy Father's intentions which I know embrace the whole universe. This is the general purpose of my life..." (pp. 253-4). In our Carmelite family, we strive to follow their teaching. We enthusiastically join together in thanksgiving for Pope Benedict and to pray that God will send us just the right Pope to guide our Church in the years ahead.

Our Superior General, Fr. Saverio Cannistrà, has written a lovely letter of thanks to Pope Benedict, which you can read at the Order's website at www.carmelitaniscalzi.com.

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (www.usccb.org) has issued several pages of prayers and resource materials for use upon the resignation of Pope Benedict and for the election of a new Pope, including two of the following prayers.

who will please you by his holiness and to us show watchful care.

Mount Carmel OCDS Renewal Course

In April 2012, I announced to the Province that the General Definitory of our Order is sponsoring a Renewal Course for English-speaking OCDS members from throughout the world. The place is the historic Stella Maris Carmelite Monastery on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land. The dates are March 3-17, 2013. The response was immediate: Many of you expressed an interest in going. I sent in applications to Rome in the order I received them. I had to put other names on a waiting list. Annual Dues

A person begins paying dues when he/she receives the scapular and becomes a member of the community. Normally, dues should be sent to the Central Office in February. (See Section XXII of our "Provincial Statutes.")

Each community and group should send in annual dues, which help support the expenses of the Central Office, the travel of the Provincial Delegate, and the travel of the OCDS Provincial Council. From the dues of the Province, we also send an annual donation to the General Delegate's office in Rome. Fr. Alzinir Debastiani has already written to express his appreciation for our Province's donation for 2012.

In these hard financial times, it may happen that a member cannot afford to pay the full \$25 annual dues. Your treasurer does not need to send us a list of who has and has not paid. This should remain anonymous.

These are the signs of love” (IV:1, 7).
