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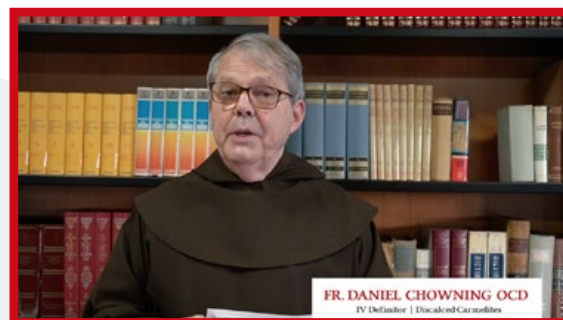
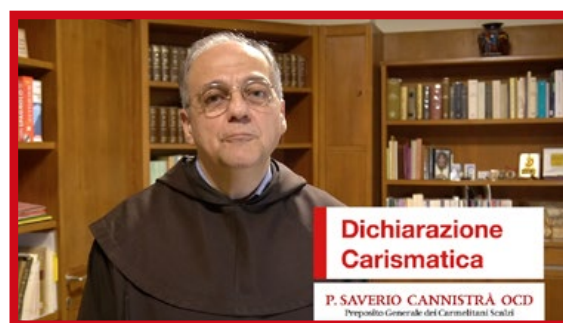
Materials for reflection

First Workshop on Charismatic Declaration in India



The First Workshop on the Charismatic Declaration began on 17th morning at Trivandrum, India. Given the number of young religious in India, two workshops on the Charismatic Declaration have been planned. The first one is being held at the Benziger Memorial Spirituality Centre at Trivandrum. This workshop is for the young religious of Malabar, Manjummel and South Kerala Provinces. 25 religious between the ages of 35-45 were expected from each Province. Helped and guided by the resource persons, the group is



working seriously on the document.

On 17th, Fr. Johannes, the Definitor in-charge of the region began the sessions explaining the background of the document, objectives of the workshop, general structure and content of the document etc. Being the resource person of the first day, he expounded the content of the first three sections on Call and Response, Formation and Charismatic Identity and the Teresian Anthropology. He prepared them for a fruitful group discussion with relevant questions. The dynamics of working this way seem to be effective and the members are understanding the text and assimilating it. Following is the schedule for the next two days.

16 Thursday : Arrival for Supper at hrs. 20.00

17 Friday : Fr. Johannes Gorantla ocd, Def. Gen. (3 sessions). Initial Presentation: History, structure and content of the document and the Study of numbers 1-19.

18 Saturday: Fr. Mathew Vekathanam ocd (Mal) (3 sessions) Study of Numbers 20-53

19 Sunday: Fr. Prasad Theruvath ocd (Manj) (3 sessions) Study of Numbers 54-79

20 Monday : Departure

Thiruvalla Monastery, Kerala, India A place for the meeting of the various rites



St. Joseph's Monastery of the Discalced Carmelites is the second oldest Discalced Carmelite Monastery in Kerala, the first one being that of Kottayam. It has a history of around 70 years. They were initially invited by the Syro Malancara Bishop of Thiruvalla, a centre for the Malancara Church in Kerala. Hence the sisters have a strong bond with the Malancara church, which in turn loves them and appreciates their life and mission in the Church. Although the daily masses are celebrated

in the Latin rite, the chapel is well frequented by the Syro Malan- cara, Syro Malabar and Latin rite faithful. Our Monastery chapel is clearly a sign of unity among the Catholic churches of different rites in Kerala.

Recently Thiruvalla Communi- ty founded a new Monastery at

Kolayad. Hence at present there are only 13 sisters in this one of the most beautiful monasteries of the sub continent.

Fr. Johannes Gorantla ocd, our Definitor General visited this Monastery on 14-15 January 2020 to encourage them in living their vocation.





Visit to CITES

University of Mysticism, by the Prefect of the Congregation for Catholic Education.

Recently, on the 23rd of January, Cardinal Giuseppe Versaldi, Prefect in charge of the Roman Congregation for Catholic Education, visited the University of Mysticism in Avila.

During the visit he was accompanied, among others, by the CITEs authorities, as well as Professor Javier Belda Iniesta, Delegate for Legal and International Affairs of the John Paul II Pontifical Theological Institute and Professor Manuel Arroba, Dean of the new section of the John Paul II Pontifical Theological Institute which, on Wednesday, January 22nd, the Cardinal inaugurated in Madrid.

While visiting CITEs, the Cardinal expressed the importance of this centre regarding forging and supporting the great ecclesial project of the New Evangelization. He also appreciated the importance of the mysticism of Teresa and St John of the Cross, encouraging the CITEs community to keep on with this work so that it can continue to strengthen the life of faith and the neces-



sary cultural, interdisciplinary and interreligious dialogue. There was no shortage of inspiring references to Teresa of Jesus and her incarnate mysticism, as an inspiring model of what CITEs must be.



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
